Sub: Grant of Conditional Permission to the Dr. BNM Rural Ayurveda Medical College & Hospital, Smt. Sushiladevi Nagar Colony, College Road Tq and Dist. Bijapur, Karnataka with 50 seats in UG (BAMS) course and 09 seats in 03 PG courses namely (i) Panchkarma -03 seats, (ii) Dravyaguna -03 seats, and (iii) Swasthvritta -03 seats and *denial of permission* for 02 PG courses namely (i) Ayurved Samhita & Siddhanta- 07 seats, and (ii) Kayachikitsa- 05 seats for the academic session 2019-20 under section 13A/13C of the IMCC Act, 1970- reg.

Sir/Madam,

I am directed to refer to the Ministry's order No. R.17011/46/2018-EP (IM-1) dated 11.10.2018 related to denial of permission for the academic year 2018-19 intimating certain shortcomings for rectification for consideration of the case for the academic year 2019-20.

2. The CCIM had carried out an inspection of the institution on 15-16.03.2019 to reassess the available facilities of teaching and practical training as well as to verify the compliance submitted by the college and forwarded its recommendations and report to the Ministry. On examining the same, certain deficiencies have been observed and therefore, under provisions of the first proviso to sub-section (5) of Section 13A of the IMCC Act, 1970, an opportunity of hearing was granted to the college on 21.05.2019 to present the case.

3. The observations of hearing committee based on submission made by the college representatives during hearing and recommendations & visitation report of the CCIM have been carefully examined in terms of Regulation 3 of the “Indian Medicine Central Council (Requirements of Minimum Standard for under-graduate Ayurveda Colleges and attached Hospitals) Regulations, 2016”, IMCC Post graduate (Ayurveda) regulations, 2016, provisions under the IMCC Act, 1970, relevant regulations made thereunder and as per approved Standard Operative Procedures (SOPs) and it is found that the College is fulfilling notified and approved criterion for granting Conditional Permission for UG (BAMS) course and 3 PG Courses and not fulfilling the criteria for 2 PG Courses (Ayurved Samhita & Siddhanta and Kayachikitsa).
